

Call for Contributed Posters

Fundació Biblioteca Josep Laporte invites you to submit contributed papers or posters for the 2007 1st Conference of Health Knowledge Management, to be held in Barcelona, October 15th and 16th.



Poster sessions comprise visual presentations of information about research or other projects related to health knowledge management. They offer conference delegates a less formal alternative to contributed posters, as well as an opportunity to interact directly with those responsible for the presentations.

You will be sent to staff your print poster during a portion of the conference (October); posters will be open to viewing by conference delegates for two days of the conference.

To submit a poster for consideration, please send an email until September 30, 2007 with the following information:

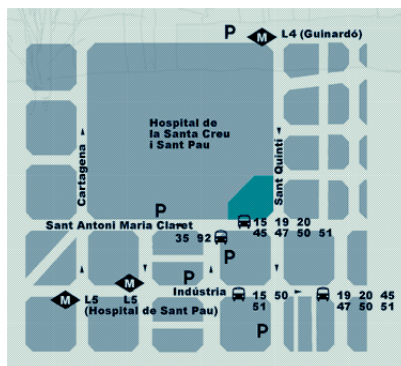
- Outline of the topic
- A brief structured abstract (no more than 250 words)
- Name(s) and contact information of the presenter(s) including contact details

Tips on designing posters:

- Include the title, the author(s), affiliation(s), and a description of the research, highlighting the major conclusions
- Posters are visual – add pictures, graphs, charts etc. to make the poster interesting
- Keep text to a minimum and use a large font size so that the poster can be read from a distance
- Keep some white space - don't overwhelm the reader with too much text or graphics
- Use colour creatively
- If you laminate the poster, consider using a low-glare or matte finish
- Consider bringing copies of your poster for hand-out
- Ensure that you poster is set up and taken down at the specified times

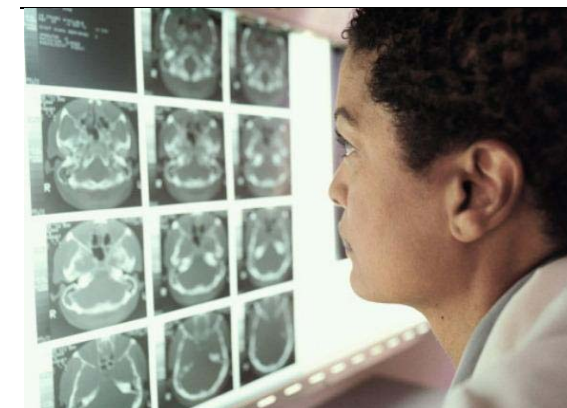

Outline programme

The information market has been transformed with the introduction of concepts such as globalisation, Internet and the World Wide Web, genomics and stem cell research, patient knowledge and the rise of public interest and participation in healthcare decisions. In fact, patients and citizens demand the same information that is available to physicians, nurses and public health departments, and this revolution has changed the way libraries serve information needs and design information services. Thus, the new questions are: Where is the future of health knowledge management? How can information services and health organizations lead improvements in the quality and efficiency of health care, education and research? How are information strategies related with policy debates about security and reliability of health information? This first European Conference aims to address these questions, through sharing experience of experts from throughout Europe and beyond.

The conclusions of this conference will be included in a report to be presented to Governments, the European Union and consumer groups and health information service providers.
